We would like to invite you to participate in the National Garden Clubs, Inc. scholarship program. Below you will find the details of this program and due dates.

By February 15, 2020: Each garden club submits their candidate to the state scholarship chairman.

By March 1, 2020: The state chairman submits the state candidate to the national chairman.

By March 15, 2020: The state chairman submits the state candidate to the regional chairman.

SUMMARY OF PROGRAMS

National Garden Clubs, Inc.

- Available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students pursuing a Master's Degree
- Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year. No doctoral program students may apply.
- Approximately 41 annual scholarships of \$4000.00 will be available.

-Student must major in:

- Agronomy
- Agriculture Education
- Horticulture
- Floriculture
- Landscape Design
- Botany, Biology
- Plant Pathology/Science
- Forestry
- Environmental Concerns (Management: Environmental, Horticulture Resource/Environmental Behavior)
- Environmental Conservation (inc. Engineering, etc)
- City (Rural & Urban) Planning
- Wildlife Science
- Habitat or Forest/Systems Ecology
- Land Management and/or other related or allied subjects.

(Applicants must be majoring in one of these fields of study with a career related to gardening, landscape design, environmental issues, floral design or horticulture.)

-Applicants must be a legal resident of the state of application.

-All applicants must have at least a cumulative 3.25 GPA (on a 4.0 point scale).

- Graduate students must also submit complete transcripts for undergraduate courses.
- Must be attending school full-time as defined by NGC.
- College or university must be accredited and listed on the official website of the U.S. Department of Education, <https://ope.ed.gov/dapip/#/home>
- Must send application to the Alaska State Chairman by the state deadline.

Pacific Region of National Garden Clubs

- One annual scholarship of \$1000.00 will be available.
- All applicants must have at least a cumulative 3.25 GPA (3.0 on a 4.0 point scale).
- Applicants must be majoring in one of these fields of study: horticulture, floriculture, landscape design, conservation, botany, plant pathology, forestry, agronomy, environmental control, city planning, land management, alternate energy, and/or related subjects.
- Available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students. No doctoral program students may apply.
- Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year.
- Must send application to the Alaska State Chairman by the state deadline.

Alaska Garden Clubs

- One annual scholarship of \$500.00 will be available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students. Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year. See above NGC requirements.
