By February 1st: Each garden club submits their candidate to the state scholarship chairman.

By March 1st: The state chairman submits the state candidate to the national chairman.

By March 15th: The state chairman submits the state candidate to the regional chairman.

- Available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students pursuing a Master's Degree
- Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year. No doctoral program students may apply.
- Approximately 43 annual scholarships of \$4000.00 will be available.
- Student must major in:

- Agronomy
- Agriculture Education
- Horticulture
- Floriculture
- Landscape Design
- Botany, Biology
- Plant Pathology/Science
- Forestry
- Environmental Concerns (Management: Environmental, Horticulture Resource/Environmental Behavior)
- Environmental Conservation (inc. Engineering, etc)
- City (Rural & Urban) Planning
- Wildlife Science
- Habitat or Forest/Systems Ecology
- Land Management and/or other related or allied subjects.

(Applicants must be majoring in one of these fields of study with a career related to gardening, landscape design, environmental issues, floral design or horticulture.)

- Applicants must be a legal resident of the state of application.
- All applicants must have at least a cumulative 3.25 GPA (on a 4.0 point scale).
- Graduate students must also submit complete transcripts for undergraduate courses.

- Must be attending school full-time as defined by NGC.
- College or university must be accredited and listed on the official website of the U.S. Department of Education, <https://ope.ed.gov/dapip/#/home>
- Must send application to the Alaska State Chairman by the state deadline.

#### Pacific Region of National Garden Clubs

- One annual scholarship of \$1000.00 will be available.
- All applicants must have at least a cumulative 3.25 GPA (3.0 on a 4.0 point scale).
- Applicants must be majoring in one of these fields of study: horticulture, floriculture, landscape design, conservation, botany, plant pathology, forestry, agronomy, environmental control, city planning, land management, alternate energy, and/or related subjects.
- Available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students. No doctoral program students may apply.
- Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year.
- Must send application to the Alaska State Chairman by the state deadline.

#### Alaska Garden Clubs

- One annual scholarship of \$500.00 will be available to Juniors, Seniors, and Graduate students. Applications may be made by Sophomores for grants awarded for the Junior year. See above NGC requirements.
